

## Chamber Unveils Plans to Launch Women's Network in 2024

I want to begin this column with saying Thank You to all the great Chamber volunteers that have said Yes when I have asked them to help make our Chamber more vibrant and more inclusive, thus making our

Chamber healthier and stronger. Two of the great volunteers that have said Yes are Trisha Barnes, Mid America Bank, and Kitrina Tinnin, Central Bank. Together with their team of Chamber Champion volunteers they are personally reaching out as new members join our Chamber to educate them on the opportunities and benefits of our Chamber and to get them involved in those opportunities. I am passionate about our Chamber becoming more

inclusive. Over the past two years the Minority Business Council has grown to over 100 small businesses and nonprofit organizations which are now connected and engaged with our Chamber. We have also focused on being more inclusive by developing programs specifically aimed at women in

business. One of the things I'm most proud of this year is a team of great women volunteers that came together this past March to host our first-ever Women's Symposium at Capital Bluffs Event Center with more than 150 women in attendance. The symposium's theme was Investing in HER: Managing the Journey, and we heard from amazing leaders about growth and leadership, the importance of mentor/mentee relationships, about entrepreneurship, about being intentional with career and life, and about the importance of managing our health. This event was so successful we are already planning for our 2nd annual symposium in March of 2025. Be on the lookout for more information. We are working hard to make it even bigger and better than our first.

The positive reaction we received to the Women's Symposium prompted us to begin creating a more permanent affiliate focused on women's opportunities, challenges and successes. We have taken our lead from other chambers around the country who have developed programs specifically for women. One of those successful models has been the Columbia Chamber's Women's Network. Our plan is to launch our own Women's Network before the end of the year and to schedule quarterly programs in 2025.

Two dynamic Chamber members have said Yes to be the inaugural co-chairs of our Women's Network. They are Kyerra Johnson, with We Speak Foundation, and Renee Duenckel, with Jefferson Bank. Kyerra and Renee are working

on a November 7 launch event that would be tied into our annual Business Leadership Summit at Capital Bluffs. We'll be sharing additional information very soon about the launch, including an Incentive to join the Women's Network that day. Startup Jefferson City will host the 13th annual Pitch It & Win It competition at the end of October and will announce the winner at the Business & Leadership Summit November 7 hosted by the Jefferson City Area Chamber of Commerce. The StartUp Jefferson City committee is proud to announce the Small Business Development Center at Lincoln University as the main sponsor for the competition again this year. SBDC at Lincoln University will be providing a total cash purse of \$5,000 to the winner. Since 2011, the competition has offered budding entrepreneurs an opportunity to pitch their business ideas for a chance at winning startup capital. This cash award is a great motivator for all competitors, but the greater value comes as each participant will receive

free professional business counseling. One lucky competitor will receive a monetary award of \$5,000 to assist with startup costs identified within their business plan.




